
A City of Portland Community Development Assisted Project

The Fifth Maine Regiment Community Center is pleased to announce that it has adopted a new name. As of December 1, 2002 the organization shall be known as the Fifth Maine Regiment Museum. During the past several years it had become increasingly clear to the Fifth Maine's Board of Directors that the name of the organization did not adequately describe the Fifth Maine's origins and present status as an historical/cultural institution. After much discussion the Board and membership approved the new name which reflects its mission "to foster a sense of history for residents and visitors by interpreting Maine's Civil War role and Peaks Island history, and by hosting educational, cultural and civic events."

The organization itself will not change. We will continue to preserve the Fifth Maine Regiment Memorial Hall and offer the same kinds of programs and services to the community as we have for the past 48 years. These include historical exhibitions, walking tours, lectures, Civil War encampments, concerts, art shows, and school programs as well as space for community-wide activities. Membership remains open to the public.

PEAKS ISLAND LAND PRESERVE



The snow, cold and sun have produced great skiing and snowshoeing in and around our island. The trails through the PILP lands in the center of the island at Battery Steele and the old gravel pit are magical in the way they wind through the woods and access areas that are inaccessible during the rest of the year. This land is all of ours now and we hope that many people are experiencing the beauty of winter here.

One of the main focus points for PILP presently is designing ways to encourage these safe, healthy and fun activities on our land and discouraging behaviors that are not. Battery Steele is important to all of us for it's cultural, historical and environmental values but it is also the site of unsafe and destructive behaviors such as fires and driving motor vehicles, and dumping.

The main goal for preserving the Battery Steele property was to ensure its future as an open space to be enjoyed by all. Dumping presents environmental hazards and destroys the beauty of the place. Motor vehicles cause serious damage to both the natural area and the structure of the Battery. Over time, the weight of the vehicles will cause the roof of the Battery to cave in. And fires could easily spread from a small to a large area in a short time because of the dry undergrowth in the forest. For these reasons all motor vehicles, fires and dumping are prohibited from Battery Steele.

PILP is in the midst of brainstorming ideas for educating and publicizing these restrictions. We welcome any and all suggestions.

And lastly, thank you to all of our members and supporters who helped us finish off the year with a very successful annual appeal. Your support enables us to continue in our work to protect the island's character and environment! Happy New Year.
