

The Fifth Maine's annual **Open House** will be held on **Sunday June 24, 2001.** The day begins with a **Pancake Breakfast** from **8 - 11 am**. The general membership met on May 8. Charles Enders and Arthur Fink were elected to fill the unexpired terms of two former Steering Committee members, Marianne Jaffe and Suellen Roberts. Volunteers are needed to serve on a nominating committee for the election in August to replace outgoing members Bob Hurley and Don Webster. Island Institute Fellow James Essex reported on the "Peaks Island Mapping Project." James detailed the use of modern software to create an up-to-date data base combining various topographical maps and aerial photography. "Lavers of information" depict such things as high/low tide markings, roads, trails, wetlands, buildings, parcels, zoning, and land in conservation. The Island Institute will continue as a partner with Peaks and the city of Portland to keep the data current and to make information available to citizens. A joint meeting on June 20 (6:30PM at Brackett Church) between PINA and the Peaks Island Land Preserve will explore the potential value, task definition, and skill sets for another Island Institute fellow to follow James. Peaks Elementary School Principal Barbara Hoppin spoke about a pending \$592,000 grant which will, if approved, provide a number of school and community services. "Project Joy" (Joining Old and Young in Lifelong Learning) is designed to: (1) enrich before & after school programs, (2) address teenage and other student behavioral problems, (3) provide a physical and emotional wellness program for seniors, children, etc., (4) start an adult education program (computer skills, etc.), and (5) deal with other situations unique to island living. The next meeting of the Steering Committee will be Tuesday, June 12 at 7:00 PM. in the Community Center.
