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

Summer Traffic and Parking Rules in Ferry Area on Peaks

Starting Memorial Day weekend, and on all subsequent Saturdays, Sundays and holidays through Labor Day, between 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., spaces on Island Ave. will be reserved for vehicles waiting to board the ferry. These spaces are on the west side of Island Ave. from Welch St. to near the Post Office.

Signs on lower Welch indicate the parking spaces reserved exclusively for waiting vehicles. Be aware that double parking while waiting for the ferry is prohibited and drivers of waiting vehicles should be prepared to move their vehicles when the line shifts.

Traffic and Parking Changes already in effect:

There is a 72 hour parking limit on vehicles in the parking lot and on Island Ave. south of Welch Street (towards the Lions Club). Violators, with state or island registration, will be ticketed and, if necessary, towed.

Except for the entrance/exit to the parking lot, the turnaround is clockwise, short term use only. Drivers must stay near their vehicles to avoid blocking and should depart this area only when pedestrian traffic on the street clears. Do not park in the entrance/exit of the parking lot.

Passenger pickup and drop-off below the turnaround at the parking lot is prohibited except as follows:


Spaces in front of Jones Landing are clearly designated for the volunteer taxi, for dropping off or picking up passengers who are disabled, frail, elderly, or have a medical need, and for the police.

Only pick-up/delivery vehicles specifically permitted by police may go below the white line (just below the turnaround) on Welch St.. They are asked to arrive before the ferry docks and to depart only after pedestrian traffic on the street clears.

Pedestrians descending Welch St. should use the sidewalks and keep clear of the freight loading area. Help avoid congestion when passengers arrive on Peaks. Please use the sidewalks as much as possible and avoid lingering in the street.

These rules were formulated by Peaks Island residents and are being enforced by the Portland/Peaks Island police. Drivers are asked to exercise care, patience and moderation everywhere on Peaks Island. Remember, the speed limit everywhere in Peaks is 20 mph! Please help us keep Peaks Island safe.
