
Environmental Committee would like to encourage everyone to <u>put their trash in</u> secured containers. Also please take advantage of our <u>curbside recycle pickup</u>.

RULES OF THE ROAD

Did you know that almost without exception the rules and laws related to operating motor vehicles on the mainland apply to island use as well. That includes many of the safety related laws.

- Seat belts must be used by operator and passengers.
- Children under 4 years of age must be placed in a child-restraint seat.
- Headlights must be turned on when you use your windshield wipers.
- All vehicles are required to be insured.

So play it safe. Keep using the good safety practices whenever you drive, whether on the island or off. Oh yes, the one exception to the rule: vehicles registered as island-only use do not need a state inspection. They do need to be insured.

REPAIRING THAT ISLAND-ONLY VEHICLE

I was recently asked what an island resident should do if their island-only vehicle needs to go to a mainland service shop for maintenance work. The answer was provided by Sgt. Peter Wentworth of the Portland Police Department. Sgt Wentworth says that you can contact the traffic division of the Police Department for a temporary transit permit. This will identify your destination on the mainland and allow you to legally drive the vehicle to a repair shop and then back to the ferry terminal.

USE OF GOLF CARTS

With the arrival of spring more golf carts are in evidence on island streets. It is legal to operate a golf cart on an island street IF you follow the following rules:

- The golf cart must be registered with the City of Portland.
- The golf cart must display the municipal registration tag when operated.
- Operators must be over 21 or possess a Maine Driver's License.
- Carts must have an operating horn, functional headlights and taillights (if operated after dark), a slow-moving vehicle insignia on the back, and a 6' antenna with a flag marker. Golf carts must abide by all traffic rules relevant to other types of motor vehicles.
