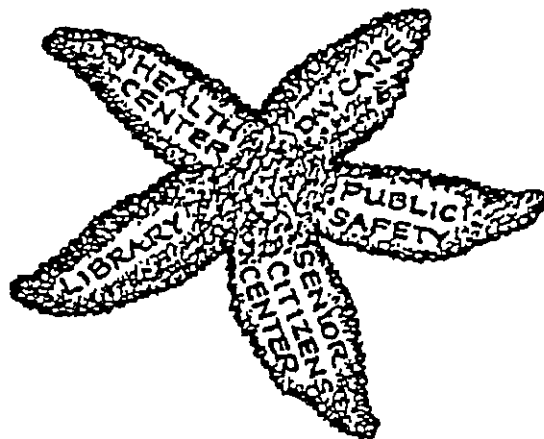

He regularly performs with the Bates College Orchestra and guest artists. Mr. Glazer has performed as a recording artist under the Vox label. *(The concert originally scheduled for this date, Principals of Roanoke Opera, had a change in schedule due to a significant award, and has rescheduled with us for the summer of 2015.)* **The Peaks Island Chorale**, our 25-voice community chorus, will perform its summer concert featuring international folk music on August 20.

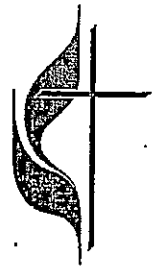
