Peaks Island Elementary School

Our fifty-seven students have arrived and are filling our school with the wonderful sounds of excitement and learning. This year, we have fourteen in the kindergarten class, eight in grade one, six in grade two, ten in grade three, ten in grade four, and nine in grade five.

We are spending these first few weeks building community and getting to know each other. These are critical times for our classrooms as we establish routines, set individual learning goals, create classroom and school rules, and plan for celebrations.

Our favorite fall activity is observing the amazing process of complete metamorphosis as we closely watch our classroom collections of Monarch caterpillars. Though we experienced a significant rate of mortality this fall, we have successfully launched several beautiful butterflies. They are now on their way to Mexico. We wish them luck and a strong tailwind!

PEAKS ISLAND TAX AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE

PITA is now PITEA to reflect the reality that both tax assistance and energy assistance are run by our small group of thirteen. We have separate accounts for each. Donors to tax assistance or energy assistance do so knowing the money will go to the designated account.

The Weiser Family won our candy apple red golf cart. Charlie Shull told them and sold them the winning raffle ticket. We sold 401 tickets and made \$8900 that was divided into both accounts.

Just as we were gearing up for the new energy season PITEA was offered the opportunity to join a new program offered by Market America to 501c non-profit organizations. Susan Marie Thomas, an Unfranchise Owner, met with us in August and explained how the program works and how it will benefit us. Market America offers individuals the opportunity to create a second source of income. Susan is a qualified independent Unfranchise Owner. With Susan's help, enthusiasm and patience we launched our portal, <http://www.ilovePeaks.com> that leads into the Market America website. You can browse and see what Market America is all about.

For six years, our small group has worked hard writing our mission statement and moving forward to help Islanders who need assistance with their property taxes. In September and March we go to City Hall with payments in hand. When our 501(c)3 status came through fundraising was a little easier.

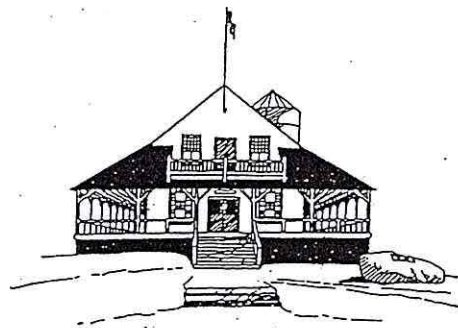
In 2009 with seed money from a few Islanders we began Energy Assistance. Our clergy are the arbiters for energy assistance, too. Eligible applicants receive \$300 worth of fuel or electricity and may apply a second time if necessary.

We thank our clergy: Pastor Beau Boyle, Pastor Desi Larson and retired minister Ruth Williamson, for their support even though their plates are already full. Lionel Plante and Associates, and Peaks Island Fuel deliver the fuel and support our program. 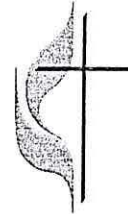

### HOME START

The Portland Planning Board held a workshop on Tuesday, September 21 for site review of the three house subdivision at 18 Luther Street, the last step in the public process. Following the workshop, a public hearing is set for Tuesday October 12 for comment and Planning Board approval on the Home Start application.

A timely grant opportunity has been created by the Maine Housing Authority, offering up to \$350,000 from the *2010 Affordable Housing Initiative for Maine Islands Program* to rehab or replace the existing home at 18 Luther Street and build one of the two new homes proposed for the property. These funds will assure two highly energy efficient, secure, affordable rentals or rent-to-own homes while helping to hold down the cost of the third home for sale.

Kaylin Beck of Luther Street won the Home Start dollhouse raffle which raised more than \$1,000. Created by Ginny Rynning the doll house also featured special furnishings, artwork and decorations produced by several other islanders. Many thanks extended to all who created and supported the fund raiser.

### **Senior News**

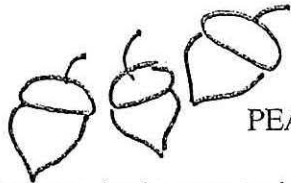

In October, Annie O'Brien will be joining us to and will lead us in songs.

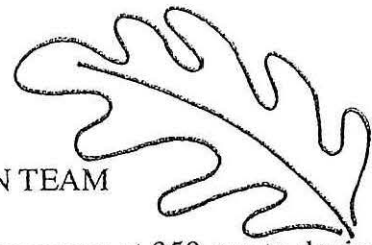
The October pot luck luncheon will be held on Monday October 11<sup>th</sup> at 12 noon at the Senior Housing Community room on Central Avenue.

We really appreciate being able to share the great history of the Regiment, the Civil War, the Memorial Association incorporated in 1871, Peaks Island, and World War II with the many islanders and day visitors that tour our Memorial Hall each season.

The Eighth Maine Regiment was selected by Joshua Chamberlain to be the honor regiment during the surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia commanded by Robert E. Lee at Appomattox Courthouse. After the war the Regiment enjoyed summer vacations here on Peaks Island where they camped in the tent grounds before Colonel McArthur generously purchased the land and built the Memorial Hall for his loyal troops. It was dedicated in August of 1891, three years after they agreed to buy the land.
