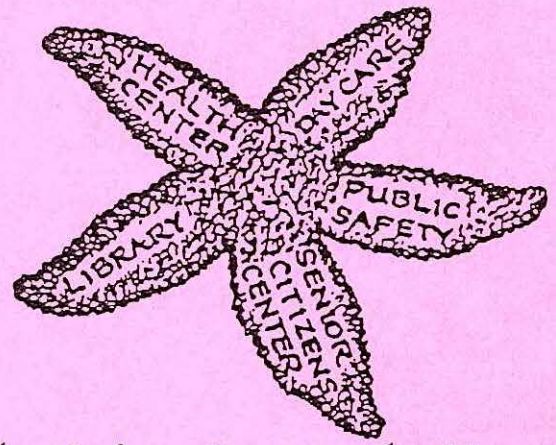

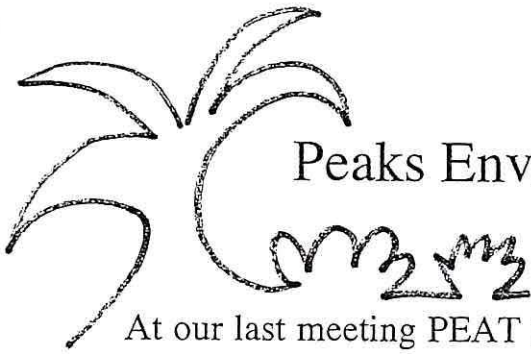

While reassuring us that, in general, wells on Peaks are in good shape, he emphasized the importance of testing wells every three years. 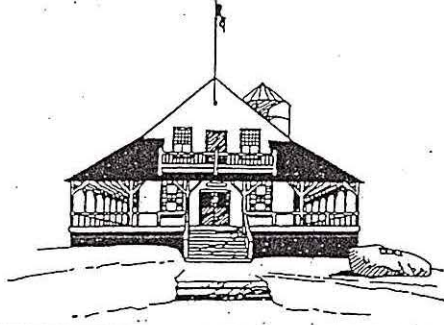
**We are located at the Brackett Memorial Church and our opening hours are:**

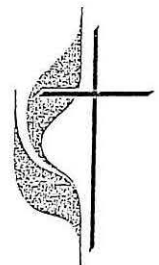

## FREE Museum Passes Available at the Library

Free passes to the following museums are available at all Portland Public Library locations:

**Portland Museum of Art** – Pass admits 2 adults and up to 6 children; one pass is issued per day at each library location.

**Maine State Museum** – Pass admits 4 people. No limit on number of passes issued.

**Portland Observatory** – Pass admits 2 people to the Observatory and/or the Guided Walking Tours of Portland. One pass is issued per day at each library location.

**Southworth Planetarium (USM)** – Pass admits 6 people. One pass is issued each day at each library location.

### PEAKS ISLAND TAX AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE (PITEA)

This summer is just flying right by. The Island has been hopping! We have welcomed so many new residents and visitors who have brought a new energy to the Island. As always people have smiles on their faces and they wave and say hello as we pass. The ambience of Peaks just keeps growing. Our charitable groups are holding fairs, races, dinners, etc. The island is a busy place. Peak Island Tax and Energy Assistance is entering into its ninth year. We just keep going like the “energizer bunny.” Our missions continue on – assist homeowners whose Island home is their permanent residence with their property tax payments. This year we will have an increase in the mil rate and that just might be difficult for some of our friends and neighbors. Applications for assistance are on the library bulletin board. Please be sure that your completed application is received by September 5<sup>th</sup> so we can pay the City of Portland on time.

Our one fundraiser this summer, a 50-50 raffle will begin our work to raise the funds to fulfill our missions. We anticipate spending \$20,000 over the next year for property tax assistance and energy assistance. Our volunteers will be ready to start fundraising all winter to reach our goal.. Each committee member helps with each fundraiser and for each Loaf and Ladle Dinner, members make and donate all the food while the Baptist Church members help us to set up, serve and clean up. Our next dinner will be held on Saturday, September 21<sup>st</sup> from 5-7 p.m. at the Peaks Island Baptist Church Hall. The fee is adults \$7 and children \$2.50. Watch for our notices which will include our menu featuring delicious main dishes and terrific desserts all prepared by our committee members and a few famous island chefs like Charles Burr who makes the most wonderful desserts.

The economy is growing stronger. The unemployment rate is heading in the right direction. We are all thankful that we made it through the downturn together and helped each other to keep a positive outlook. New folks have moved onto the island and they have added their talents to different committees and activities. The cost of energy still fluctuates and some of our friends and neighbors will need a little assistance to keep their homes warm and their taxes paid. Peaks Islanders will be ready to answer the need and to supply whatever is needed. Look around and you will see the faces of the people who have been so caring and generous. Are we a rich island, heavens no, but our residents are Neighbors Helping Neighbors.

**NEW** at the Library for History Buffs: *Maine, the Wilder Half of New England* by William David Barry

Almost the size of the rest of New England, Maine was the first colonized and is the most forested, sparsely settled, and perhaps, the most independent-minded of New England states. This concise, solid, and surprising overview traces 500 years of Maine history, from first contact between Native Americans and European explorers to the achievement of a Down East identity, national political power, and worldwide cultural identification. Changes in the economy, religion, ethnicity, arts, leisure, and education have all shaped Maine and Mainers, with some intriguing results. Illustrated with well over 200 images drawn from the collections of the Maine Historical Society, the Maine Historic Preservation Commission, Special Collections at the Portland Public Library, the Maine State Museum, local historical societies, private collections, and even the Vatican, these pages contain many rare and fascinating drawings, paintings, and photographs.
