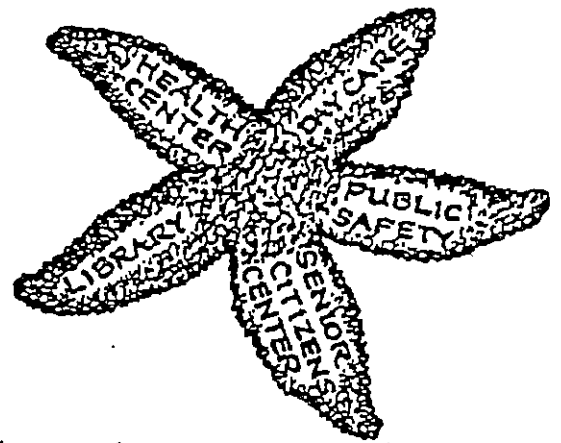

A **SPECIAL concert this month:** Ambassadors of their state, the world traveling, dignitary-serenading, television-starring fabulous Maryland State Boychoir will sing at (and co-sponsored by) Brackett Church Saturday night August 2 at 7:30 pm. Free concert – an offering will be taken to help defer expenses.

The Wednesday night Summer Concert Series brings a final two summer concerts to the Fifth Maine. On **August 6** is the esteemed **Pianist Mr. Frank Glazer**. Recently featured on NPR and WCSH Channel 6, the amazing 99-year-old Glazer is currently Artist-in-Residence at Bates College, and was formerly Professor of Piano at Eastman School of Music. We have made a few changes but PITEA is on a steady course and Islanders have stepped forward to help us achieve our mission year after year. We have been the recipients of many donations from Islanders – permanent residents and summer friends and Island businesses. The Peaks Island Baptist Church, Jones Landing, Brackett Church and the Island Inn have allowed us to use their facilities for our fundraisers. The Clergy have served as arbiters of our two funds. All of this was done by volunteers so that the funds raised could be used for either tax or energy assistance. How lucky we have been! Our Clam Chowder and Lobster Roll Dinner was a big success and we hope to repeat the dinner next summer and maybe even once this winter.

Kimberley's Travels held a tent sale over July 4th and the sale was very successful. Kimberley Edwards and her husband Byung chose PITEA as the charity which they would support this year. Kimberley's exciting news that she had a check for almost \$600 for PITEA could not have come at a better time. What a wonderful way to start our fundraising for 2014-2015.. Her group on Bali did a fantastic job of tie dying fabric and sewing the clothing; and many of her creations can be seen all around us.

Please join us for our Old-Fashioned Bean supper. Our menu is evolving but we will be serving homemade beans, ham, hotdogs, vegetarian beans, coleslaw, gingerbread, and more. August is the time when the City sends out the property tax bills. Our applications will be on the bulletin board of the Peaks Island Library in mid-August and the Clergy will be ready to accept applications. Our volunteers will be ready to start fundraising all winter to reach our goal. Our committee members have worked hard to raise the funds and members make and donate all the food we serve while the Baptist Church members help us to set up, serve and clean up. Energy Assistance met the needs of Islanders whose applications were accepted by the Clergy. We also had to up the donations to \$400 because energy costs increased throughout the year. \$300 did not go far last winter which was colder and longer than the past years.

Casco Bay Lines News

Recently the CBL Board voted to extend to all board members -- starting after the November election -- free ferry passes for their respective terms. The reasons were varied, but can be encapsulated thus: by creating incentive to serve, we might see heightened interest and involvement in elections and board meetings; and by having free passage to all islands, board members might visit other islands more regularly, thus addressing some us-vs.-them (Peaks vs. Downbay) challenges on the board. Time commitments to serve on the board are considerable, from two or three hours a month at a minimum, to 8 or ten hours (and sometimes much more) per month, depending on the committee assignments and the issues du jour. (There was discussion -- and a motion -- regarding how to implement the plan yet effectively ameliorate criticism of self-dealing: instead of having the plan go into effect on a rolling basis at the end of each member's term, the decision was made to have it go into effect at once, in November. However, board members can choose to not participate in the benefit until after / if each is re-elected. Several have made that choice already, as have I.) Casco Bay Lines has become a complex entity with serious challenges, big money, and ever-changing demographics. I can say with confidence that it is well run and offers unparalleled service. However, our hope is that this change will encourage heightened interest and engagement in this unique ferry system. So-- please pick up nomination papers, gather your signatures, and let's see a record turn-out for our fall elections. Nomination papers must be returned no later than August 25, 2014 by 12 pm,

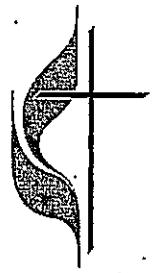

Curtis Rindlaub will give a brief presentation on the progress of the Ice Pond acquisition, followed by Bob Bittenbender, a Maine Audubon naturalist and Oceanside Conservation Trust board member, who will discuss the ecological significance of the Ice Pond as it relates to the Daveis Sanctuary, Skillings Woods, and Peaks Island as a whole.
