### PEAKS ISLAND TAX AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE

The snowy weather will be here before we know it. The weather forecasters on Channel 6 are predicting a snowy winter and we will have some time to enjoy small moments of silence and beauty as we go about business. We know the snow brings colder weather and more difficult times for our friends and neighbors. Here on Peaks we are part of a community that cares about our neighbors and friends and no one needs to live in a cold home. We are watchful without being invasive and we try hard to be sure that everyone is safe and warm.

For the last eleven years PEAKS ISLAND TAX AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE has been able to help homeowners and renters with their energy costs. Applications may be found on the library bulletin board and then filed with a member of the clergy. Assistance of up to \$325 will be paid to the energy provider. If you believe a neighbor needs help but is not applying, please speak with a member of the clergy. He or she will look into the situation and make sure that assistance will be provided in a timely fashion. It is our intent that all help is given anonymously.

As part of our fundraising during the year, we do schedule Loaf and Ladle Dinners throughout the year. In July and August we will sponsor another Lobster Roll Dinner and a Old-fashioned Bean. All of our events are wonderful opportunities for friends and neighbors to get together to enjoy a delicious dinner while we do the cooking, the cleanup, etc. Our next dinner will be in January. **WHALEBACK PHOTO IN THE LIBRARY:** On May 19, 2017, Howie Motenko, a photographer from Seal Harbor, Maine (<https://acadiaphotosafari.com/>) came to Peaks Island to take a special photo of Whaleback as part of his artistic project called, Painting Islands (<http://paintingislands.com/>). In this community based project, Howie approached the residents of each of Maine's year-round islands to determine, by popular vote, the most important and visually distinctive location to photograph. Using a team of resident island volunteers with flashlights, he "painted" an iconic scene with light to create a long-exposure photograph. After Peaks voted on Whaleback as its location, Howie had to calculate the perfect tide and sunset time, since these conditions make a huge difference in the final shot, and May 19th at sunset was selected. **Over 70 Peaks Island residents gathered to shine their lights and create this amazing image,** and a big party at the 5th Maine Regiment Museum followed. This photo and the others from the project were displayed together to raise money for Maine Sea Coast Mission (<https://seacoastmission.org/>), and then the individual photos were sent home to their islands for display.
